A huge congratulations to Niamh, who was part of the winning debate team alongside students from Southfield, and to Flora, who was awarded Best Debater of the event!




#### Maths

#### **English**

10t-En1

Through the contrasts between the characteristics of monarchs Edward, Macbeth and Malcolm, Shakespeare explores defining qualities of rightful kingship and catastrophic consequences of ambition and illegitimacy in doing so, emphasis is put on the necessity of the natural order and highlights the central juxtaposition between order and disorder.

In Act 4 Scene 3, Shakespeare uses Malcolm's description of King Edward the Confessor to present an image of a rightful, divinely chosen monarch. As Malcolm speaks, he displays King Edward's selflessness when he says, "How he solicits heaven, himself best knows," showing his deep and personal faithful relationship with God. King Edward's religious acts convey a sense of pure compassion and the way he "solicits heaven," shows that his desire to help others is genuine and not done with the intent of personal and selfish gain. Furthermore, this phrase also solidifies the idea that King Edward is the rightful king of England as it links him to God showing his authority directly comes from the divine making him conform to the divine right of kings. Mis religious imagery also portrays King Edward as a healer who has been gifted by God showing he has the highest power on his side unlike Macbeth who been abandoned by him due to his act of regicide. Moreover, the fact that "himself best knows" is an admirable quality as it shows that King Edward does not boast about his achievements and virtuous deeds as he finds substantial praise in his quiet faith and services. In addition, this short sentence proves that all of King Edward's actione benefit England, making it a fruitful, prospering country. A Jacobean audience would have worshipped a king with the country's best interest at heart and found comfort in the knowledge that their monarch's priority was their safety.

Contrarily, Shakespeare constructs Macbeth to directly contrast King Edward, presenting him as the image of a tyrannical and unnatural kingship using Malcolm as an advocate once again. This is shown when Malcolm states that Scotland "Weeps, it bleeds, and each new day a gash is added to her wounds." This indicates Macbeth's selfishness as he is acting oblivious to the fact that his actions are affecting the country. The personification of the country hyperbolises the vulnerability and endangerment of Scotland ever since it was stripped of Duncan's rule and usurped by Macbeth. This increases the magnitude of Macbeth's actions, therefore villainising him and making him a tyrant. Furthermore, the recurring motif of pain and damage seen in the words "bleeds," "gash" and "wounds" shows a constant feeling of deep affliction, meaning Macbeth lacks benevolence and does not take on the nurturing attributes as King Edward does. This links in with the reputation of

#### **Modern Foreign Languages**

The Languages Department continues to use The Language Gym website (Language Gym - Home) to support our language learning. This is a website designed by Gianfranco Conti, who is a specialist in applied linguistics, and how we learn languages.

Every student who studies a foreign language is given access to the Language Gym, which can be used for self-study, as well as for homework assignments and revision. There are many different exercises and games on the site that promote vocabulary learning, sentence building and fluency – for example try the Boxing Game to increase your speed in using the target language!

We hope your children find the site useful; their teachers will have explained how to access the website. Students and parents alike are welcome to explore the site unaided to improve their language, rather than wait to be set some homework.



#### Year 13 Road Safety Workshop

On 20th October, our Year 13 students took part in an important Road Safety Workshop, delivered by the Northants Safer Roads Alliance. The session aimed to raise awareness of the risks and consequences associated with unsafe behaviour on the roads.

Students explored the dangers of drink and drug driving, learning about the serious impact these choices can have on lives and futures, as well as the legal implications — including driving bans, heavy fines, and potential prison sentences. The workshop emphasised how the law applies to all road users and the importance of making responsible decisions behind the wheel.

In addition, students learned about the current laws regarding e-scooters and e-bikes, gaining a clear understanding of what is legal and illegal when using them on public roads and pathways.

This informative and engaging session provided our students with valuable knowledge to help them stay safe, make informed choices, and understand their responsibilities as future drivers and road users.
